Overview of the Year

The 2021-2022 school year, Richmond Waldorf's 25th in operation, was one to remember. Our community continued to adapt to the ongoing pandemic, while keeping our students' learning experiences at the forefront of their work. While we experienced some transitions in school leadership, we committed to our work as colleagues and community members and saw growth, learning, and progress throughout the year.

We also saw record enrollment with 185 students by year's end, with 5 fully enrolled Early Childhood classes and our largest grade school to-date. Reduced COVID restrictions also meant reengaging with each other in person through coffee mornings held by the PA, fun-filled festivals, Parent Education classes and class meet-ups.





Highlights from Fall

We began our 25th year with the Rose Ceremony to welcome Mrs. Letitia Amey's 1st grade class. We celebrated Michaelmas in September, Lantern Walk in November, and Spiral Walk in December. These fall festivals ground us in the rhythms of a new year.

Our 8th graders had an incredible 4-night long biking trip in the foothills of Pennsylvania in October, courtesy of Mr. Roberto Trostli and Mr. Glenn Amey.

Finally, we held our 1st Annual Holiday Faire in December, bringing local artisans, handmade crafts, festive food and drinks, and were delighted by the strong turnout of so many Waldorf community members!





Highlights from Spring

Spring began with our 3rd and 4th graders journeying to Hawthorne Valley Farm in upstate, NY for their farm trip.

Our 5th and 6th graders also spent an amazing few days at the Spikenard Bee Sanctuary in the Blue Ridge Mountains. We were happy for classes to be able to make up these special trips that were missed last year.

We once again welcome Friends & Family into our classrooms via an entirely virtual Friends & Family day.

We celebrated the triumphant return of our in-person May Faire, welcoming more community members than ever before onto our campus for a beautiful celebration of spring.

We finished the year with an impressive production of A Midsummer Night's Dream, featuring fantastic acting from the 8th grade students and inspired direction from class teacher, Roberto Trostli.

Field Day, Graduation, and a heartfelt Final Assembly ended the year with spirits high.

We are incredibly proud of the Class of 2022, Richmond Waldorf's 13th 8th grade class. They are headed to an impressive list of high schools in the fall.









Our 25th Anniversary



It has been a year full of celebration as we commemorated the 25th Anniversary of our beloved school in big ways and small.

This past winter, students worked closely with our artist-inresidence, Merenda Cecelia, to create four mosaic pieces that now live on the front of our building.

Merenda proposed that we create four separate mosaic pieces, each incorporating tiles created by our student body. She envisioned tall, vertical panels, each incorporating the underground realm, the earthly realm, and the heavenly realm, illustrating how all are interconnected.

This parallels Waldorf education, which emphasizes the connections between academic subjects, practical skills, and nature. Waldorf education also deeply believes in the importance of environmental stewardship and being in harmony with the earth, which dovetailed perfectly with Merenda's vision.

Merenda met with each of our classes in small groups, gave a short tutorial on working with clay, and gave them their task for the collaborative project. Each age group was assigned a different realm to create into, with our youngest students creating the beginnings of life in the underground realm, up to our oldest students creating glorious images from the heavenly realm.

The end result was truly more spectacular than we could have imagined! There was a special presentation to unveil the work at our 2022 May Faire, where we dedicated the mosaics together as a community, and took time to reflect on the past 25 years.

To cap off our celebratory year, we gathered RWS families and supporters from near and far at the Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden for a 25th Anniversary Gala & Silent Auction. We danced, laughed, reunited, and heard from long time community members about their time at RWS. It was a beautiful evening, and a chance for our community to begin to imagine what the next 25 years may hold for Richmond Waldorf School.




